FROM THE BISHOP

Dear All, Every one of us has been affected by the trauma which Canterbury has undergone in the last week. Even at this distance, many of us felt the quake, and all of us know someone there or are in other ways personally connected with what has happened. As Anglicans, we are further connected as we see the terrible damage inflicted on many of Canterbury's beautiful and deeply loved churches. We can however be immensely proud of the way our fellow Diocese in Christchurch has risen to the challenge presented by the earthquake, ministering to Anglicans and to the wider community with compassion and wisdom. Particularly we can be grateful for the inspired leadership of Bishop Victoria as she encourages and unifies her people.

There is an opportunity to be part of this, and we have a number of actions we are taking as a Diocese.

Firstly and most importantly, I am asking all parishes to pray: with thanks for the very low level of casualties; for Canterbury; for the Diocese of Christchurch; for Bishop Victoria; for the clergy and laity of the Diocese; for those worshipping communities which have suffered damage to beloved churches

Enclosed is a list of "sister parishes", at least two Christchurch parishes for every one of ours. [Cashmere and Geraldine] Please pray particularly for those communities in public and private prayer. Where possible and appropriate, it would be helpful to make contact with those parishes, to assure them of your support and to seek ways in which prayer and other assistance may be focused.

I also request that all parishes make a special offering on Sunday 19 September for the assistance of the Christchurch City Mission and for the ministry efforts of the Diocese of Christchurch. This will be in addition to the usual Sunday offering. I attach a statement which can be read in this regard in churches on Sunday, September 19 or adapted and read out to give people some advance notice this Sunday, September 12.
