FROM THE BISHOP

Dear All.

A few Saturday mornings ago I was in Wanaka and was woken at 4:35am by the dreadful earthquake which has laid waste to so much of Canterbury. Many of you had similar experiences, and most of us know someone in Christchurch or its surrounding environs. We are all, in one way or another, personally connected with what has happened.

As Anglicans, we are further connected as we see the terrible damage inflicted on many of Canterbury's beautiful and deeply loved churches. As Paul says, if one part of the body suffers, we all suffer. We can however be immensely proud of the way our fellow Diocese in Christchurch has risen to the challenge presented by the earthquake, ministering to Anglicans and to the wider community with compassion and wisdom. Particularly we can be grateful for the inspired leadership of Bishop Victoria as she encourages and unifies her people. As well as this, the work of the Kingdom is being ably carried out by the Christchurch City Mission, which is flat out giving assistance to those of every faith or of none who have suffered loss.

There is an opportunity to be part of this, and we have a number of actions we are taking as a Diocese, but I am particularly asking that every parish makes a special appeal, this Sunday September 19. In addition to your usual offering I am asking that people make a Christchurch Earthquake offering. You may like to further specify on an envelope whether you would prefer your donation to go to the City Mission or to Bishop Victoria's discretionary fund for use as she sees fit.
