King Charles the Martyr.



King Charles The Martyr was the last saint to be canonized by the Church of England. He is honoured as a martyr because he died for the Church. He was offered his life if he would abandon episcopacy but he refused for this would have taken the Church of England away from being part of 'the one Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church'. In the words of Dr. Mandell Creighton, Bishop of London 1897-1901 and a noted ecclesiastical historian: "Had Charles been willing to abandon the Church and give up episcopacy, he might have saved his throne and his life. But on this point Charles stood firm: for he died, and by dying saved it for the future'. With the Restoration of Church and King on May 19, 1660, Charles was canonized and his remembrance added to The Prayer Book. He is also honoured for his strong personal piety and for his protection and patronage of the Church.
