Readings for Today.



1st Reading: Deuteronomy 11.18,26-28, 32.

Moses said to the people: 'You shall put these words of mine in your heart and soul, and you shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and fix them as an emblem on your forehead. See, I am setting before you today a blessing and a curse: the blessing, if you obey the commandments of the Lord your God that I am commanding you today; and the curse, if you do not obey the commandments of the Lord your God, but turn from the way I am commanding you today; to follow other gods that you have not know. You must diligently observe all the statutes and ordinances that I am setting before you today'.

2nd Reading: Romans 3. 21-25, 28.

Brothers and sisters: Now, apart from Law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the Law and the Prophets, the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God: they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood. For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.

Gospel: Matthew 7. 21-27.

Jesus went up the mountain with his disciples and began to teach them: 'Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven. On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many deeds of power in your name?' Then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; go away from me, you evildoers. Everyone then who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built a house on rock. The rains fell, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on rock. And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not act on them will be like a foolish man who built his house on sand. The rain fell, the floods came, and the wind blew and beat against that house, and it fell – and great was its fall!'

The Collect:

Almighty God, you alone can bring order to our unruly wills and affections; give us grace to love what you command and desire what you promise, that in all the changes and chances of this uncertain world, out hearts may surely there be fixed where true joys are to be found; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **AMEN.**

God of the desolate and the despairing, your Son, Jesus Christ, bore the cross of suffering that is for us the source of life and healing.
