The Parish AGM

The usual potluck luncheon will follow the meeting.

Reports for the AGM Parish groups are asked to provide Joy Henderson (People's Warden) with reports as soon as possible so that they can be typed and placed in the Report Book for the AGM. **Southern Coastal Deanery Appeal** Jesse Bessant is Fr Neville Selwood's great-grandson. Jesse has been diagnosed with a rare brain stem tumour. The family needs to raise \$20,000 for special treatment in Texas. The Southern Coastal Deanery is selling Hot Cross Buns to help raise money. Details and order forms are at the back of church and in the Link. There has been a good response so far. **The orders have to be in by March 16 so don't delay.**

A New Beginning As from next Thursday, the Vicar will be celebrating a monthly Eucharist at Francis Hodgkins Rest Home. This is an appropriate ministry as the Home is within the Parish boundaries and there are half a dozen parishioners resident there. **Descent into Hell**: On the Monday night of Holy Week, 2 April, the 7pm Mass will be followed by a lecture in the Church given by the Vicar entitled "The Descent into Hell." This will be an introduction to the 20th century Swiss Catholic theologian Hans Urs Von Balthasar, and his unique theology of Holy Saturday.

Lenten extra, This week the Lenten 7 pm Mass, followed by a Bible Study in the Vicarage, has been rescheduled from Monday night to Wednesday night February 29 as the Vicar will be taking a funeral in Christchurch on Monday. In the weeks following we will settle in to the normal rhythm of Monday night being our Lenten extra night. A reminder that the Bible Study will consider of the New Testament readings for the following Sunday (see 'Liturgy for Today' section of the Pebble), and will conclude with a time of silent meditative prayer.

Today's sermon: is entitled "One Foot in Eden." As Jesus enters the wilderness for his time of testing he must sojourn amongst the animals that live there, some of whom would be predators, but in fact he is safe there. Some commentators have pointed to his ability to generate a kind of second Eden experience in microcosm in that brief period of time, in that small part of the creation, in which the urge to kill and eat appears to have been briefly suspended, at least as far as those creatures who might have wanted to dine on him. Theology in recent times has become interested in the possibility of the final fulfilment of the non-human creation. In this perspective the sentient beings we share life on this planet are no longer to be seen as just a scenic backdrop to the drama of human salvation - God wants to bring the whole of the creation back to himself. But there are one or two challenges that go with this point of view.

Power, Violence and War: Following Jesus Today Richard Burridge, who is Professor of New Testament and Dean of King's College, London, will give an open lecture on this topic on Tuesday at 5.15 pm in the Archway 3 Lecture Theatre.
