Parish News

Today's sermon is entitled, "Why walls must come down." The epistle to the Ephesians uses the image of a wall, built by all the fears, suspicions and hatreds of the human race in its inability to cope with difference and otherness, which could potentially divide the Church in the same way. But Christ by his death on the cross has pulled off a sociological miracle, breaking down the wall between outsiders and Jews, and uniting all the different sections of the human family into his new Temple, the Church. Thus the Church today has no excuse for dividing itself into ethnic enclaves, or turning itself into a homogeneous haven for birds of a feather flocking together. It is to be a vive la difference community.

A prayer tip Scripture is a rich mine for personal prayer. One way into this treasure house of resources is to take the Sunday readings, and to slowly read through them

until a line, a sentence, or a phrase stands out. Then slowly turn it over in your mind in a contemplative way, allowing it to calm the mind, and to engage with it in a more than rational way so that intuition, imagination and memory also consider it. Then shorten the phrase until only the essentials stand out, and let this mantra be the theme of your time with God. When the time of prayer comes to an end the chances are that the phrase of Scripture will echo through your day. Augustine of Hippo had a wonderful way of expressing this. "God has sent us letters from heaven – they are the books of the Bible."

Margaret Fraser RIP Margaret Fraser, one of the great characters of the 8 o'clock congregation, died on Wednesday morning. Her funeral will be at Gillions on Monday at 2.30 pm with Fathers Carl Somers-Edgar and Hugh Bowron presiding.

Synod meets in Dunedin over the weekend of 14-16 September.

Annual adjustment It is appropriate that we adjust our giving to the parish each year as salaries, wages and benefits are generally annually adjusted upwards, and of course the parishes costs annually increase. A greater generosity towards God and his Church would also be much appreciated to meet the challenges ahead of insurance costs and earthquake strengthening. At present our giving does not meet our month-by-month expenses, and so we draw down our bequest income to meet the shortfall. In the future the bequest income will need to be focussed on the challenges just mentioned, with the living Church paying its way, and not just relying on the generosity of the Church of former times to sustain it.
