#### **Parish News**

**Today's sermon** From the time of the Council of Ephesus on in the 5<sup>th</sup> century the cult of the Blessed Virgin Mary began to grow in the Church, particularly amongst lay people. This proved to be an enduring phenomenon, whose increasing fervour and devotional accretions caused a major backlash at the reformation. But the Anglican Roman Catholic International Commission agreements have found common ground on thorny subjects, such as the doctrine of her immaculate conception and her assumption into heaven, which the western church

celebrates at this time. Both churches are agreed that they wish to see devotion to Mary purged of medieval excesses, and in no way contradicting the unique meditiatorial role of her Son Jesus Christ in the economy of salvation. Today's sermon considers Mary's useful role as a pointer to what resurrection will mean for us.

Praying for the Diocese The Bishop has asked that each parish set time aside over the weekend of 31 August to 2 September to pray in intercession for the Diocese, asking that God's will be known to us in what we should do in the years ahead to meet our present challenging situation. Accordingly on Saturday 1 September a votive Mass of the Holy Spirit will be celebrated at 10 am, and the Church will be open for prayer throughout the day for parishioners to come and do just that, concluding at 4 pm with Evening Prayer. A roster, divided into half hour slots, is on the foyer noticeboard for us to enter in our prayer time. A note book has been provided in which parishioners can write in suggestions that have arisen from their prayer time as to helpful new courses of action the diocese could take in future years to reform and renew its life.

**Jennifer Fraser RIP** Last Wednesday the parish bade farewell to a regular member of our 8 am congregation, Jennifer Fraser, who was also a devoted flower arranger and beautifier of our church.

**The big 60** The Vicar turns 60 on 5 September. There will be a 5.30 celebration of the Eucharist using the Liturgy of St Basil, followed by a party in the Vicarage. No presents please, nor is it necessary to bring anything with you, but any offerings of finger food or beverages would be most welcome.

**The Fellowship Group** will have a pot luck tea this Tuesday, 21 August at 6.30 pm. Barbara Turnbull a former Red Cross nurse in Afghanistan will be our speaker.

Anticipating Synod Fr James Harding, our guest preacher at the Patronal Festival, will be sponsoring a motion at the diocesan synod on the subject of conflict of interest in diocesan affairs. This is a timely motion for in such a small diocese there is a temptation and a tendency for links of affinity and tight knit family groups to garner to themselves a number of diocesan roles that can complicate and confuse good decision making in crucial matters.

The Caversham lectures After the Holy Week start with the Vicars lecture on Hans Urs Von Balthasar's theology of Holy Saturday, the Caversham lectures resume in October with a presentation on "Karl Rahner and the concept of the anonymous Christian, Can Atheists, Buddhists, Hindus, Muslims be implicit Christians?" This will be on Monday 15 October, with the paper being given at 2 pm for those who don't like travel at night, and will be repeated at 7.30 that evening, with the parish hall being the venue. Then in the month of Rowan Williams retirement as Archbishop of Canterbury, a paper will be given entitled, "The strange, wonderful and bleak theological world of Rowan Williams."
