Parish News

<u>Today's sermon</u> Entitled "Does God Change," it pivots off the verse in the today's epistle about "the Father of the lights of heaven. With him there is no variation, no play of passing shadows." Some theological commentators of recent times have argued that God changes and develops in tandem with the changes of human history, and that he

suffers in solidarity with the tragedies of human beings. But the God of traditional theism does not change or suffer, does not become the prisoner of human dilemmas and limitations, and as we shall be hearing, that is very much to our advantage.

Parish forum A parish forum will follow the 10.30 am Service today. It will consider the diocesan reorganisation plan, and the agenda for the upcoming diocesan synod.

Fellowship and Friendship groups The St Peter's Friendship group meets on Tuesday 11 September at 2 pm in the lounge. The St Peter's Fellowship group will meet for coffee (or tea) and cake at Pier 24 on Tuesday 25 September at 7 pm.

Pre-Synod meeting The Revd Jan Clark is convening a pre-synod meeting to discuss the agenda before the diocesan synod. This will meet in the St Peter's hall on Thursday evening at 7.30 pm.

Vestry meeting The recent Vestry meeting decided to authorise the purchase of a Book of the Gospels to be used for the gospel procession at the 10.30 am Liturgy. It was agreed that the parish should accept its suggested diocesan share of \$3,659, down from \$5,778 last year. It was noted that the parish has now received a letter from the DCC instructing it to obtain an Initial Evaluation Procedure on the earthquake readiness or otherwise of the Church. It was agreed that an image of the interior of the Church should be placed on the Hillside Rd noticeboard as the default position display notice when there is not a notice announcing some forthcoming event.

The Raffle The raffle was drawn at the recent Vestry meeting, and the winner is Joan Graham, Heather Brook's mother, with second prize going to Nancy Scurr, and third to Karen Merilees, both of Frances Hodgkin's. The raffle has raised \$681 towards the repainting of the hall.

Thank you to those who came to Church yesterday to pray for the Diocese. Your written prayers will be offered on the altar at the 10.30 am Service.

Reorganising the Diocese A discussion document has been received for discussion by Archdeaconries which proposes that in place of the present 30 parishes the Diocese be divided into 15 ministry units, each of which will have at least one stipended priest. Some of these ministry units will incorporate many rural communities, for instance one quite close to us would include Kurow, Omarama. Omaru north, Maheno, Palmerston. and Warrington. Looking to Dunedin Waikouaiti. parishioners will be relieved to hear that St Peter's would continue to be a ministry unit on its own. All Saints would absorb the North East Valley, Roslyn would take in Mornington and Brockville, and the Peninsula will be grouped up with St Kilda, Green Island and Port Chalmers. Copies of this document are available for your perusal at the back of the Church.

The big Six O The Vicar turns 60 on Wednesday. There will be a 5.30 celebration of the Eucharist using the Liturgy of St Basil, followed by a party in the Vicarage.
