Parish News

Today's Sermon Today's gospel reading includes Jesus' challenging teaching on the subject of divorce and remarriage. Like the first reading from Genesis it points to the way in which the Christian understanding of how we are to behave in intimate relationships is anchored in God's intentions in creation. It makes the measuring stick of our ethical actions in this sphere of human endeavour to be what does God want of us, what does God expect of us, what did God intend us to be in creating us the way we are, rather then what does our surrounding society and culture expect of us. Given the debate currently going

on in the Church about human sexuality and the nature of marriage this is a very topical Scriptural theme.

Parish forum There will be a parish forum after the 10.30 am Service next Sunday, at which Fr Hugh will report back on the recent diocesan Synod. This has been deferred by one week as Fr Hugh will be flying to Wellington after this morning's main Service to preach at the Collation of the incoming Archdeacon of Belmont this evening, returning to Dunedin first thing tomorrow morning. Fr Hugh took the Revd Janet Tait's pre-ordination retreat just over a decade ago. She will have pastoral responsibility for the Hutt valley, and succeeds the Revd Damon Plimmer, who will be instituted as the Vicar of the Clutha on Thursday. Fr Hugh officiated at the wedding of Damon and Raewyn at St Mary's Addington some time ago.

Karl Rahner and the Anonymous Christian Karl Rahner anticipated earlier than many theologians the effects and implications of the spread of unbelief and atheism in western societies. He was also aware of the considerable sway that the other major world religions had over the loyalties and attachments of a considerable proportion of the world's population. They weren't going to go away anytime soon, and Christianity had to take account of that as it adjusted to being another of the world's religions. What then was going on at the deepest level in the hearts and minds of people of goodwill and unselfish lifestyles who said that they did not believe in the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ? Might Christ have found a way to connect with them at a subterranean level of their deepest being without them being aware of it? Might the drama of salvation be played out in their lives as they responded to the choices of daily living? The lecture on Monday 15 October considers this concept of the anonymous Christian, and is also an introduction to some of the major themes of one of the most powerful speculative minds of twentieth catholic theology. It is being given at 2 for those who don't like to travel at night, and will be repeated with a little more detail at 7.30 that evening. Venue: The Parish Centre.
