<u>Today's Sermon</u> Today's sermon is entitled, "His difficult teaching about wealth." One of the most acutely embarrassing texts for preachers to deal with down the ages is today's gospel text with Jesus' uncompromising teaching about the spiritual dangers of wealth accumulation. This morning's sermon considers the three

main lines of argument that are usually deployed to ameliorate this tough teaching, why they don't quite work, and then presents the Vicar's attempt to come to terms with it.

Parish forum There will be a parish forum after the 10.30 am Service this morning, at which Fr Hugh will report back on the recent diocesan Synod. This forum will start promptly and will proceed with despatch so that the parish lunch can begin at around the usual time.

Karl Rahner and the Anonymous Christian Karl Rahner anticipated earlier than many theologians the effects and implications of the spread of unbelief and atheism in western societies. He was also aware of the considerable sway that the other major world religions had over the loyalties and beliefs of a considerable proportion of the world's population. They weren't going to go away anytime soon, and Christianity had to take account of that as it adjusted to being another of the world's religions. What then was going on at the deepest level in the hearts and minds of people of goodwill and unselfish lifestyles who said that they did not believe in the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ? Might Christ have found a way to connect with them at a subterranean level of their deepest being without them being aware of it? Might the drama of salvation be played out in their lives as they responded to the choices of daily living? The lecture on Monday (tomorrow) considers this concept of the anonymous Christian, and is also an introduction to some of the major themes of one of the most powerful speculative minds of twentieth century catholic theology. It is being given at 2 for those who don't like to travel at night, and will be repeated with a little more detail at 7.30 that evening. Venue: The Parish Centre.
