<u>Today's Sermon</u> Today's sermon is entitled "Ambitious, power hungry, status seekers need not apply." Within the circle of the twelve disciples an inner group of three, Peter, James and John, have emerged. They were with Jesus on the Mount of Transfiguration. But Peter, having recognised Jesus for who he really is, has then blotted his

copybook by trying to talk Jesus out of his impending sacrificial death. Sensing their opportunity, James and John press forward with a request for places of honour at the right and the left hand of Jesus when his Kingdom comes in all its glory. This is an ironic request, since two thieves will flank Jesus as he reigns over the creation from the cross. This status-seeking request becomes an introduction to some straight talking from Jesus on the subject of suitable leadership qualities in the Jesus movement. As ever there are major surprises for his listeners in terms of the background assumptions of their culture on this score, as indeed there are for us. So it is that over this, and the last two Sundays, Jesus has given astringent teaching on the subject of power, sex and money. We are left wondering who is able to live up to these high standards? But it isn't just something we achieve in our own strength - with God all things are possible.

<u>Caversham lectures</u> Last Monday's presentation attracted around 14 people to the 2 pm lecture, and around 20 to the evening one. Gillions assistance in providing, and setting up, their PowerPoint presentation equipment was particularly appreciated. The next Caversham lecture will be on Tuesday 5 December, on the theme of "The strange, wonderful and bleak theological world of Rowan Williams." This is timed to coincide with his stepping down as Archbishop of Canterbury.
