Procession Our 10.30am Service this morning begins with a procession around the Church. Please feel free to join in.

Today's Sermon is entitled "That extra dimension of being." All Christians are called to be saints, yet when we measure ourselves by the heroic dimensions of some whom the Church remembers by name, we can feel that we will never even get into the starting blocks. But as we reflect on the beatitudes, the charter for saints, we come to understand that "grace precedes requirements," as Donald Hagner put it, that what is asked of us is also given by God.

Anglican Consultative meeting The Anglican Consultative Council has now concluded its meeting in Auckland. There has been a patchy turnout from the global south delegates who could have been there, and the Bishops from the Fellowship of Confessing Anglicans and the Global Anglican Future Conference have staved away. So the representation from Africa and Asia is not what it could have been. The Anglican Covenant was all but dead by the time the meeting began, so presumably it will be laid to rest with as much dignity as possible. And with the news of Rowan Williams' retirement now well known leaders in the Anglican world will already be looking past him to see who will emerge as the next Archbishop of Canterbury, and what agendas will emerge as the next major focus of the Communion's life. The American Episcopal church may well be estimating that it has all but got away with its recent controversial changes with little major contestation from the instruments of Communion. So with this a largely non-event meeting, the big issues of the unity or fragmentation of the Communion, and the changes needed to promote the future flourishing of the Communion, remain unresolved. The Archbishop of Canterbury is visiting Christchurch this weekend.

New thurible Our thurible, which we use for burning incense at the Parish Eucharist, is becoming harder to use as its chains become unstable. A parishioner has taken the initiative in seeking out a suitable new one, and has generously offered to fund most of its purchase, with David Hoskins and the Vicar chipping in.
