Today's Sermon is entitled "That Quality of End Time Living." Paul has some advice for the new Christians at Thessalonica about how to love one another, and how to extend that love beyond the borders of their faith community. This quality of life will also enable them to live through any imaginable catastrophe. But this style of end time living is not

achieved by gritting our teeth, and repeating to ourselves over and over again, "I must be a loving person." Rather it is a gift, as the Holy Spirit, the personalising person, gradually makes us come alive as the person God always wished us to be.

Christian World Service As Advent dawns our compassionate concern turns to the many in the third world who lack the necessities of life. Christian World Service is the ecumenical agency that translates New Zealand Christians desire to help into effective aid programmes that empower the world's poor. You will find CWS aid envelopes inset with this edition of the Pebble. A new feature this year is the option of giving a specific necessity of life to a third world person.
