<u>Today's sermon</u> is entitled, "The clues to his destiny." Mary and Joseph were subjected to every parent's nightmare when Jesus went missing in order to engage in a theological sparring session with the doctors of the law. But did they do well to be

surprised at what their precocious child had got up to given the clues already provided by various messengers as to his real identity and mission. The follow on issue for us is whether we are able to love our children, and others for that matter, for who God wants them to become, rather than because we hope they will play out various agendas dear to our hearts.

Social gathering The Vicar will provide drinks and nibbles for the New Years eve social gathering in the Vicarage, but any contributions of food and drink would be appreciated.

Fine waved Vestry members were relieved to hear recently that the Fire Service had decided to waive the \$1,100 fine it proposed to impose on the parish because of the three false alarms generated from the hall over the past 18 months. The Vicar had written to the Fire service pointing out that we have now replaced all the fire sensors in the hall. A follow on issue is whether we still need a monitored alarm given that the Vicarage is now tenanted.

Film season resumes From mid to late January a series of the best religious films of recent years will be shown on successive Monday nights in the Vicarage. These will include the outstanding Finnish film that came out this year, "Letters to Fr Jacob," (14 Jan) the Russian film, "The Island," (21 Jan) and, "Molokai," (28 Jan) the story of Fr Damien and his ministry on the leper island of Molokai. But moviegoers need to go to Mass first on those Monday evenings.
