Today's sermon is entitled, "The return of superstition and paganism." The three wise men are likely to have been astrologers from the court of a Kingdom outside the frontiers of the Roman Empire – their function to divine the future for the local ruler. Our society prizes rationality, sophisticated

technology and freedom from traditional religious claims and obligations. Yet as G K Chesterton pointed out, "When men stop believing in God they start believing in everything." Starting out with what appears to be harmless good fun, and then proceeding to alternative, ancient spiritual practice as outré and authentic, not a few of our contemporaries are embracing the kind of magical thinking that is a front end introduction to the kind of superstition and paganism that hindered human flourishing in the days before the Christian era. An informed Christian faith should inoculate us against these forms of folly and spiritual blindness.

Best books of 2012 The Vicar has found John Lanchester's novel Capital to be an illuminating and entertaining explanation of the world economic crisis we have been passing through. By following the fate of several very different London lives, and the developments in one of the city's streets, the reader comes to understand something of the madness that caused the world de-leveraging crisis. Barbara Kingsolver's *Flight Behaviour* pivots off the remarkable effect that the unexpected arrival of a large swarm of monarch butterflies has on a variety of lives in a backwoods part of America. This apparently miraculous arrival is a sobering introduction to the effects of global warning, without ever being preachy or propagandist. It is as good as her previous Prodigal Summer in combining credible and interesting characters, together with a close attention to the natural world and the ecological challenges that arise from our relationship with it.

Film season resumes From mid to late January a series of the best religious films of recent years will be shown on successive Monday nights in the Vicarage. These will include the outstanding Finnish film that came out this year, "Letters to Fr Jacob,"(14 Jan) the Russian film, "The Island," (21 Jan) and, "Molokai," (28 Jan) the story of Fr Damien and his ministry on the leper island of Molokai. A 7 pm Eucharist will precede the screenings.
