Today's sermon is an explanation of how the Church has arrived at its present thinking and practice in its

sacraments of Christian initiation – baptism and confirmation.

Confirmation Have you been confirmed? The introduction of the admission of baptised children to communion in recent years has resulted in far fewer confirmations than there used to be. Confirmation is a valuable opportunity to deepen your walk with Christ, to further your Christian education, and to claim the promises made on your behalf by your parents and Godparents. An adult candidate has begun instruction, and the Vicar would welcome enquiries from others who are interested in claiming their full sacramental credentials of Christian belonging.

Procession A procession around the interior of the Church will begin our 10.30 am Liturgy. Please feel free to join in.

Best books of 2012 Hilary Mantel's Bring Up the Bodies was 2012's brilliant successor to Wolf Hall, an insider's view of the court of King Henry 8th through the eyes of Richard Cromwell, the able civil servant who did so much to further the King's designs, and to advance the cause of the Reformation. Cromwell has been vilified since A Man for all Seasons depicted Thomas Moore, one of his victims, as a saint and a man of outstanding integrity. The cleverness of Mantel's novels is that she shows Cromwell as a man with his own particular set of virtues, who, if we do not totally sympathise with his methods, we can at least admire his ability, and empathise with his personal situation. To understand the origins of the Church of England, and of Anglicanism, as we now know it requires knowledge of Tudor history. This gives it to us in part, and without the endless titillating obsession with Henry's wives that make up

so many recent books and films. Now the reading public are waiting agog for the publication of the third in this series of novels, in which Cromwell will go the block as a result of arranging a marriage that does not please his psychopathic master.

Film season resumes Tomorrow night the outstanding Finnish film, "Letters to Fr Jacob," will be shown in the Vicarage. The Russian film, "The Island," will be shown on Monday 21 Jan, and "Molokai," will be shown on 28 Jan, the story of Fr Damien and his ministry on the leper island of Molokai. A 7 pm Eucharist in the Church will precede the screenings.
