<u>Today's sermon</u> Today's Nehemiah reading describes a pivotal moment in the development of Jewish

religion when the people gather together to hear the Scriptures read aloud, and then have them explained to them. The notion that people can be powerfully connected to God by a collective listening to the Word of God is a cornerstone of Synagogue worship, is unknown to many of the major world religions, and has been powerfully influential in what we do in the first half of this Service, the Liturgy of the Word. How then can we let the Word have powerful sway in our midst as we listen attentively to it together?

**Lectern** The lectern, which is used for lectures, funerals and Vigil Services, has been stained to blend in with the pews, and is now back in its accustomed place near the choir pews.

**Repainting of the hall interior** is almost complete. Fundraising for this project continues as we have resolved to meet the costs through parishioner subscription, and are only half way there so far.

Hermeneutical hui The Vicar will be in Auckland from Wednesday to Saturday, in the main attending the last of the hermeneutical hui on human sexuality as one of the Dunedin diocesan representatives. Archbishop David Moxon instituted these hui some years back in an attempt to bring peace to the Church by searching for common ways of reading the Bible, and so approaching the texts on controversial areas of human sexuality in a way that opened up dialogue. In a way this event will be his Provincial swan song before he departs to Rome in a few months time to be the Anglican Communion's ambassador to the Holy See.

Wanted - A Minister who believes in God A Danish parish has placed just such a nationwide advertisement, and has attracted worldwide publicity. The Danish clergy union has decried the advertisement, saying that it limits clergy freedom of belief, which says it all about the extent to which Danish Lutheranism has lost the plot. For analysis of this self-destructive tendency in some sections of the western church go to Margaret Wente's article in the Canadian Globe and Mail, entitled, the collapse of the liberal church, which is also on our noticeboard.
