<u>Candlemas</u> Today we celebrate the feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, which ends the season of Epiphany tide. It also marks exactly a

year since the Vicar was instituted to the parish. The sermon is entitled "Creatures of the Spirit." As we prepare to process around the Church at the beginning of the 10.30 am Service we bless the candles in this manner:

Priest: May the light and peace of Jesus Christ our Lord be with you.

The Lord bless you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

He is worthy of all thanksgiving and praise.

Blessed are you, Lord our God, King of the universe! You make our darkness be light. For with you is the well of life and in your light we see light.

Blessed be God forever.

(The Priest blesses the candles, and then says) We wait for your loving kindness, O Lord,

in the midst of your temple.

Open to us the gates of righteousness

that we may enter and give thanks to the Lord.

God is the Lord who has shown us light,

Let us offer in his dwelling an oblation with great gladness.

(the procession then begins)

Return to traditional music settings for the Sunday Eucharist It has been some years since we sang music from the Schubert Mass at the 10.30 am Solemn Sung Eucharist. Beginning in Lent we will resume the use of this attractive and accessible music, which will have the added advantage that the people's responses will now be in English, not Latin. The Eucharistic rite remains the same, with just a few minor adjustments to simplify things.

Hall alarm and 'phone False alarms, including last Sunday afternoon, on the hall fire alarm has almost brought upon us a heavy fine from the Fire Service. Accordingly direct monitoring of the alarm has been cut off, a measure that was introduced during the interregnum, when the Vicarage was untenanted, and the alarm is now sound only. The hall 'phone will now be removed as its main use was as the signal conduit for the alarm, and as most people now have cell phones. This saves the parish just over \$600 a year.
