This morning's sermon is entitled "When the manna stopped falling," a reflection on the Joshua reading. It leads us in to a deeper understanding of how and why we powerfully recall crucial events of salvation history in the Sunday Eucharist.

Mothering Sunday Today is mothering Sunday. Sprigs of rosemary will be blessed and given out after the Service.

Pot luck lunch A pot lunch follows the 10.30 am Service as is our custom on the second Sunday of the month.

Lent Bible study We continue to work our way through the epistle to the Galatians in our Monday night Lenten Bible studies. Tomorrow night we turn our attention to the fourth and fifth chapters of the epistle in which the relationship between law and grace comes centre stage, and which concludes with the famous words about the fruit of the Holy Spirit, love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, fidelity, gentleness and self-control. A 7 pm Eucharist precedes these Bible studies, which then follow in the Vicarage.
