Parish News

<u>Today's sermon</u> is entitled, "Interpreting the Interpreter," and focuses on the Holy Spirit's role as the unscrambler of misunderstandings about God's communications with the human race through his Son the Word, who is in himself God's explanation of what he is up to in seeking out and saving us.

<u>Red Cross Choir</u> This morning we welcome the Red Cross Choir at the 10.30 am Service to enrich and inspire our

worship. We look forward to an opportunity to meet them personally over morning tea after the service.

The Fourth Caversham lecture will be on Tuesday. The Vicar will continue his series on framers of Anglican identity by talking about Richard Baxter, the Vicar of Kidderminster, and an outstanding Puritan Divine. He lived through the tumultuous era of the Cromwellian Protectorate when for 15 years the Church of England was abolished, and then the aftermath of the Grand Ejection when, after the restoration of the monarchy, all those clergy who could not accept Episcopacy and the Prayer book were driven from their livings. Baxter tried to chart an eirenic middle path between these extremes, and as such represents an alternative Puritan future that might have been. By seeing off the Puritans the Church of England declined their methods of becoming a disciplined, confessional and pastorally effective Church. Had it therefore condemned itself to becoming a Church of lukewarmness and mediocrity? Richard Baxter wrote the first and the third hymns we are singing today. The lecture will be given at 2 pm in the hall for those who do not like to travel at night, and will be repeated at 7.30 pm Big days in May (and June) We will celebrate the Ascension next Sunday 12 May, the Vigil of Pentecost on Saturday evening 18 May using the Liturgy of St Basil followed by a potluck dinner, then follows Pentecost Sunday 19 May, Trinity Sunday 26 May, Corpus Christi 2 June. On Saturday evening 1 June we will have the second in our continuing annual series explaining the origins of the Eucharist, which will include an appropriate liturgy, some teaching, and a shared meal. This is called the Agape banquet.
