Procession In keeping with our celebration of the Ascension today our 10.30 am Service will begin with a procession around the interior of the Church, which you are most welcome to join.

Potluck lunch As is our custom on the second Sunday of the month, a potluck lunch will follow the 10.30 am Service.

The Fifth Caversham lecture will be on Tuesday. The Vicar will continue his series on framers of Anglican identity by talking about Frederick Dennison Maurice. Dismissed from his teaching post at King's College London for questioning the doctrine of eternal punishment, he became the darling of liberal Anglican opinion. He had also added to his reputation by flirting with emerging Christian socialism. What did he actually believe, and what implications did his position have for liberal Anglicanism in the years ahead? The lecture will be given at 2 pm in the hall for those who do not like to travel at night, and will be repeated at 7.30 pm

Pentecost Vigil readers requested Please sign the notice on the Link noticeboard if you are available to read a lesson at the Pentecost Vigil Service next Saturday evening 18 May at 6 pm. We will use the Liturgy of St Basil to celebrate the Eucharist at this Service. The Bishop's chaplain has requested that the eve of Pentecost be used as an intercessory opportunity for the needs of the diocese, and we shall do so at this Service. A potluck meal will follow in the hall, with your contributions of food or drink welcome.

Agape banquet On the eve of Corpus Christi, Saturday evening 1 June, we will be investigating the Eucharistic Prayer of Hippolytus, the stem liturgy of most western Eucharistic liturgies, and the most influential formative influence on modern Eucharistic liturgies. We will celebrate this liturgy at 5.30 pm, have some teaching about it, and then enjoy a potluck meal in the hall.

Diocesan sexuality hui The diocesan family will gather on Saturday 25 May to hear the various strands of opinion within it on the subject of partnered gay relationships, and the possibility of gay Christian marriage. The Bishop suggested this event after this particular subject brought paralysis to last year's diocesan synod. This event, which will be at St John's Roslyn, is open to any communicant Anglican. It would be helpful if there were a good turn out of articulate orthodox Anglicans.

Human rights commission The Anglican Church made headline news this week when the Bishop Auckland was brought before the human rights commission for denying ordination to a partnered gay man. Ironically Ross Bay, and his assistant Bishop Jim White, are supporters of this cause, but as usual St Matthews in the city is not prepared to wait for due Synodical process, and wants to storm the ramparts now. The gentleman concerned feels he is entitled to ordination having studied for the ministry for 5 years. But no one is entitled to ordination – the Church must discern whether this call is genuine, and if this ministry is in fact required, and if the person concerned has a lifestyle congruent with the call to holiness.
