Today's sermon is entitled "Until the Lord Comes," and focuses on the verse in the 1Corinthians reading which reveals the way in which we anticipate living in the future glory of the Kingdom of God each time we celebrate the Eucharist.

<u>Rescheduling</u> <u>Gore</u> Last week's snow caused the rescheduling of the sixth Caversham lecture to this coming Tuesday. The Vicar will conclude his series on framers of Anglican identity by talking about Charles Gore. One of the most inspiring churchmen of his generation, Gore paved the way for Anglo-Catholicism to occupy the high ground of the Church of England in the mid twentieth century. He cured Anglo-Catholicism of many of its blind spots, and helped initiate the third phase of the Oxford movement, that of liberal Anglo-Catholicism. But he who was such an inspiring prophet struggled in the role of Bishop. A PowerPoint presentation will accompany this lecture.
