Parish News

Procession This morning's 10.30 am Service begins with a procession around the interior of the Church, which you are most welcome to join.

Our Patronal festival began last night with Choral Evensong, followed by a potluck meal. Our guest preacher

this morning is the Revd Jonathan Hicks, who is completing his PhD in theology at Otago before moving to the Solomons next year to teach at a local theological college. We welcome also at the 10.30 am Service his wife Tess, their children Ava, Cohen, Caeli, Judah, and his mother Cheryl. During morning tea the Vicar will be dialoguing with Jonathan about his future ministry in Melanesia in order to further the link forged with that Province through Rosemary Brown's missionary ministry there in former years.

Horizon group The Horizon group is a spiritual development programme for the elderly that will run over 7 succesive Monday afternoons at 2 pm through July and early August, beginning tomorrow. Based at the Frances Hodgkins complex, meeting on level 5 of the apartments building, and very much aimed at the needs of residents, it is nevertheless open to all parishioners who may wish to attend. St Peters has in any case quite a number of parishioners there. The Vicar will lead the sessions, with input also from guest speakers, such as Dr Anna Holmes, a local palliative care specialist, and Chris Maxwell, a dementia care nurse. A copy of the programme is on the noticeboard.
