Parish News

What is Ordinary Time We have now concluded the major cycle of feasts that marked the end of the Easter Season, Pentecost, Trinity, Corpus Christi, St Peter and St Paul, and now move steadily through the Sundays in Ordinary

Time, in which we continue to explore Luke's gospel, the gospel of Year C, and give thanks for God's grace in creation, renewing it, keeping it in being, and eventually complete it in glory. For this reason the liturgical colour is green, or green for growth as we were told in Sunday School. The Sundays in Ordinary time conclude with the feast of Christ the King, the prelude to the season of Advent.

Anglican's giving breaks 900 million pounds mark in Britain Parish incomes continue to increase, passing 900 million pounds for the first time at 916 million, up 20 million on 2010, according to the latest parish finance statistics published by the Church of England. Income from giving in 2011 increased by 1.3% to 546 million, with planned giving exceeding 10 pound per subscriber each week for the first time and tax efficient giving reaching 10.70 a week. At 46.40 pounds a month, this is more than double the average national donation to the charitable sector of 17 pounds a month. Please consider adjusting your giving to St Peters as part of an annual increase. This year's AGM identified the importance of increasing parishioner giving income to reduce our dependence on using bequest income for routine running costs, and thus enabling us to save to meet the eventual high costs of earthquake strengthening the Church.

Horizon group The Horizon group is a spiritual development programme for the elderly that is running over 7 successive Monday afternoons at 2 pm through July and early August, based at the Frances Hodgkins complex, meeting on level 5 of the apartments building. Tomorrow Dr Anna Holmes will be talking about the recent medical advances that have lengthened average life spans, and the importance of doctors differentiating between grief and depression in the prescribing of anti-depressants. A conclusion she has come to is that participation in voluntary groups is a significant factor in helping us to live longer.

Congratulations to Tubby Hopkins for being awarded the Silver Award in national recognition for his service to community patrols. Tubby has been an original member of Community Patrols New Zealand since 2002 when it was launched to watch for unusual or suspicious activity in South Dunedin streets.
