Parish News

Horizon group The Horizon group is a spiritual development programme for the elderly that is running over 7 succesive Monday afternoons at 2 pm through July and early August. Tomorrow's session considers what makes for a good funeral, and the importance of planning one's own.

Hospice facts Last week's Horizon group meeting was at the Hospice and learned that that the Hospice is 2/3rds funded by the district health board and 1/3 from community fund raising. It has 9 beds, with average stays of 6 to 7 nights from the purpose usually of repite care or of getting patients comfortable with medication adjustement. There are around 160 patients in care from the Hospice, with most being cared for at home by the community team. Only a small percentage of local folk die in the Hospice, with most dying at home or in a rest home, and some in hospital.

Bishop to visit Vestry The Bishop will meet with Vestry for an hour in September as part of his out and about engagement policy, and in order to outline current diocesan reorganisation plans. The Vestry intends to draw up its own list of topics it wishes to raise with him.

Shrinking Synod At last year's Diocesan Synod the Vicar successfully brought forward a motion to reduce the size of Synod, with Diocesan Council to advance the formula for doing so in tandem with Diocesan reorganisation. Last week's Diocesan Council meeting decided that each parish should be allowed to send one priest and one lay person to future Synods. This is more drastic than that which the Vicar envisaged since, with the Diocese reducing from 30 parishes to a smaller number of ministry units, Synod would reduce to a modest number indeed. While this would make for an expeditious passage of business, the proposal may run into opposition on the floor of Synod from multi centre rural parishes, and abundantly clergied parishes, who may feel that difficult selection decisions lie ahead. However, the proposal is a vast improvement on the present vastly inflated Synod, in which some small parishes can send many local shared ministry priests to Synod.
