Today's sermon is entitled, "Communitarian Rituals, or How Changing People's Dining Habits Changes Them." The culture of Jesus' day was hospitable and hierachical. It was a shame and honour culture that let people know where they fitted in in the scheme of things by how it placed them at table. Jesus made meals a centrepiece of his ministry, but changed the rules of the game in how they were arranged. The early Church followed him in this in ways that give us much food for thought today.

Synod in September The Diocesan Synod will meet from 27 to 29 September at St Hilda's. The Diocesan Council has decided to follow up on the Vicar's motion of last year for reducing the size of Synod by proposing that each parish send one priest and one lay person to Synod in future. This would make for a much smaller Synod, and one perhaps that will get through the business faster. It will be interesting to see how this proposal fares on the floor of Synod.
