**Fellowship group** The St Peter's Fellowship group will be holding a Pot Luck Tea in the hall, followed by a talk by Mr Douglas Clark of the Red Cross on Tuesday 24 at 6.30 pm. Please advise Gay Webb ph 476 1613 to let her know you are coming.

**Synod in September** The Diocesan Synod will meet next weekend at St Hilda's, concluding at 5 pm on Saturday evening. Motions to divest from companies involved in fossil fuel extraction and production, and to support the living wage campaign, will be before the Synod, and have already been endorsed by the Auckland Synod. There will be a proposed revision of the Cathedral statute, and a motion to unite the parishes of St Martins North East Valley and All Saints into one. There will also be motions proposing to considerably downsize Synod in future, and to dissolve and reallocate trusts and bequests that can no longer anwer the purpose for which they were originally intended.

**GAFCON 2** The second Global Anglican Future Conference will meet in Nairobi, Kenya from 21-26 October, around the theme "Making Disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ." This will be one of the first great tests of the new Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby as to whether he can insert himself into the leadership of the event, or stay away while skillfully mitigating its effects. Parishioners may recall that GAFCON 1 took place shortly before the last Lambeth Conference as a way of upstaging that event, taking participants away from Lambeth, and protesting against the perceived lack of leadership by the last Archbishop of Canterbury, Rowan Williams.

**Spring blossom bus tour** A bus expedition has been organised for Saturday 5 October to catch the spring blossom season by following a route through Middlemarch, Naseby, the Clyde dam lookout, Alexandra, Roxburgh, and Milton. Tickets are on sale now at \$30 and can be obtained from Kate Paterson or the Vicar.
