Synod report back The Diocesan Synod concluded yesterday evening. The Vicar will report on its deliberations at a parish forum following this morning's 10.30 am Service.

Harvest festival/Thanksgiving Sunday Next Sunday we give thanks to God for all his blessings to us through the natural world in which we are priviliged to live, and from which we draw our sustenance. This will also be an opportunity to thank God for all his blessings and generosity to us in so many aspects of our lives. The custom of keeping harvest festival was missed last year, and has been brought back at parishioner request, thus the slightly unusual time of the year in keeping it. However it does key in with the spring growth which we now see all around us.

Financial facts Next Sunday marks also the start of our October stewardship programme. It starts on a note of thanksgiving for all of God's goodness to us in our Sunday Service theme, and will also include an opportunity to become fully informed about the parish's current financial situation. This will take place through the medium of a parish forum after the 10.30 am Service at which a financial facts pamphlet will be given out. At this year's AGM we published a budget for the year ahead for the first time. Next Sunday's presentation will be an opportunity to see how we are doing 10 months into the year relative to our expectations and planning.
