Wardens meeting highlights The guest preacher at next year's Patronal Festival will be the Revd Eric Kyte, Vicar of St John's Roslyn and the Vicar General. It was noted that 2015 will be the 150th anniversary of the parish. Planning for the celebration will need to start early next year. It was decided not to hold a Vestry meeting in December. It was noted with gratitude that a donation of \$500 has been received for the St Peter's renovation fund.

Other working bee objectives Last week's Pebble recorded the parish's gratitude for the clearing away of the build up of garden rubbish in the vicinity of the hall, and the gardening work that has brought our Church grounds up to a high stanbard. Other worthwhile future tasks include painting the Vicarage front fence, clearing the spouting and drain covers around the hall and the Church, and tidying up the fence lines and hedges. .Christchurch Cathedral saga Recently the group campaigning to restore Christchurch Cathedral back to its original gothic state lost their appeal to the Supreme Court to preserve the landmark. They have vowed to fight on through two other cases still before the courts - one which was made as an interim decision to stop the demolition, and another that would force the diocese to explain how it would pay back insurance money used to construct the new cardboard Cathedral. They may also be hoping that the Historic Places Trust will withhold permission for the demolition to proceed. At the heart of the group's difficulty is the problem that they are trying to foist a building on the diocese of Christchurch that it no longer believes it wants. There always were liturgical and hospitality space limitations in the original building, and often during capacity crowd Services worshippers found themselves stuck behind pillars unable to see anything. Safety factors and the time it would take to restore the original also figure in the diocesan calculations, as does cost, perhaps the decisive factor. An insurance shortfall is anticipated, perhaps up to \$30 million, and there are 200 other buildings to repair, 38 of which sustained damage of over \$50,000.
