From "Little Gidding" by T. S. Eliot

With age comes wisdom, and an increased capacity for carrying out a searching moral inventory on ourselves. Things we previously complacently accepted as OK in our conduct are revealed for what they really are, as T S Eliot makes clear below. Today's gospel passage speaks of this heightened ethical awareness, and what to do about it.

Let me disclose the gifts reserved for age

To set a crown upon your lifetime's effort.

First, the cold friction of expiring sense

Without enchantment, offering no promise

But bitter tastelessness of shadow fruit

As body and soul begin to fall asunder.

Second, the conscious impotence of rage

At human folly, and the laceration

Of laughter at what ceases to amuse.

And last, the rending pain of re-enactment

Of all that you have done, and been; the shame

Of motives late revealed, and the awareness

Of things ill done and done to others' harm

Which once you took for exercise of virtue.

Then fool's approval stings, and honour stains.

From wrong to wrong the exasperated spirit

Proceeds, unless restored by that refining fire

grace accompanies call and demand, by means of which God gets to work on our inner moral decision making, our desiring and deciding, to slowly and progressively make us wiser, stronger, more self controlled Christians. If being a Christian is a matter of Belonging, Believing and Behaving, today's gospel reading tells us how God attends to the behaving part of our Christian walk.

St Peters Renovation Fund The recently created St Peters renovation fund has made its first report back since its investment in the Diocesan Trust Board Growth Fund. The \$98,969 invested represents 46,417 units in the Growth Fund, and has now grown to a value of \$104,902 by virtue of two additional gifts. The renovation fund is the bequest money the parish has set aside to deal with the eventual cost of earthquake strengthening and roof replacement. It welcomes parishioner gifts and bequests as a way of securing the future of our Church, and has already been supplemented in this way.

The Christian Formation Group As Lent begins in early March the Christian Formation Group will begin its life, meeting on Monday nights with a 7 pm Eucharist in the Church, and then adjourning to the Vicarage to study the New Testament Mass readings for the following Sunday, followed by a period of silent prayer which will lead off from those readings, and will conclude with intercessory prayer for the parish. Refreshments will follow.
