Love of Enemies

Ulrich Luz comments on today's gospel passage:

Therefore two things are required in the modern situation: (a) radical pacifists who as "fundamentalists of the kingdom of God" with their practice and their proclamation remind the church and the world that under no conditions does God approve of force; and (b) pragmatists who take consciously responsible political steps to minimize force and thus help this power-crazed world become somewhat more humane.

The two ways are ultimately complementary, because both Jesus and Matthew understand the renunciation of force as an expression of love. However, love has the freedom to think about its consequences. Based on our text, therefore, in the final analysis there can be no alternative between an ethic of sentiment and an ethic of responsibility, either in the Christian's behaviour or in the Christian's life together in the church or in the world.

The existence side by side in Jesus and Matthew of the renunciation of force and the demand for love is able to remind Christian love of its origin in the kingdom of God and of the radical quality it has from that origin. It is able to keep love from being merely a secular aid for survival.

St Peters Renovation Fund The recently created St Peters renovation fund has made its first report back since its investment in the Diocesan Trust Board Growth Fund. The \$98,969 invested represents 46,417 units in the Growth Fund, and has now grown to a value of \$104,902 by virtue of two additional gifts. The renovation fund is the bequest money the parish has set aside to deal with the eventual cost of earthquake strengthening and roof replacement. It welcomes parishioner gifts and bequests as a way of securing the future of our Church, and has already been supplemented in this way.
