This inauguration of the penitential season of Lent is a day of obligation. **The Christian Formation Group** As Lent begins the Christian Formation Group will begin its life, meeting on Monday nights (first meeting 10 March) with a 7 pm Eucharist in the Church, and then adjourning to the Vicarage to study the New Testament Mass readings for the following Sunday, followed by a period of silent prayer which will lead off from those readings, and will conclude with intercessory prayer for the parish. Refreshments will follow.

**Caversham lectures** The dates for the Caversham lectures have now been confirmed as Tuesdays 6 May Percy Dearmer and the formation of the English Hymnal, 13 May Sir Ninian Comper and the most beautiful Churches of C20<sup>th</sup> Britain, 20 May Dom Gregory Dix and "The Shape of the Liturgy," the book that radically changed thinking about liturgy, 27 May Austin Farrer great preacher and teacher of the 1950's and 1960's, 6 June Michael Ramsey Archbishop of Canterbury and exemplar of holiness, at 2 pm then repeated at 7.30 pm.

New development in Christchurch Cathedral saga Recently the Historic Places Trust went public with an offer to broker negotiations between the Church Property Trustees and those seeking to retain the original Cathedral with a view to retaining something of the original structure as a heritage memorial. This past week Bishop Victoria Matthews has declined to enter negotiations on such a partial retention, saying that it would take time to consider any request because of the Church's workload and pressing issues, including continuing legal action with the greater Christchurch building trust. Since 2012 the Trustees had been open about their concerns with any retention plan. She said that going public with such an offer appeared to be an attempt to pressure the Church into a particular course of action, and as such was counter-productive. HPT is perhaps attempting to get itself out of a hard place since the Cathedral restorers have been trying to draw it in on its side by persuading them to refuse to issue a permit for demolition, and will be aware that it faces a determined Bishop, and a diocese unenthused about restoring a building that was not one of Gilbert Scott's most inspired creations, and which always had considerable practical limitations in its liturgical and social meeting uses.
