Another Ukrainian dilemma The current war of nerves in the Crimea, which may well culminate in Russia annexing this home to its Black sea fleet, has religious aspects to it, as Russia looks to other eastern areas of the Ukraine with significant Russian populations. The Russian Orthodox Church has always been closely controlled by the government, be it the Tsar, or Soviet dictators, and both Stalin and Putin used and use it to further Russian interests in its near abroad. In Stalin's time the state assisted Russian Orthodoxy to seize Churches, Monasteries, and Church property belonging to the Ukrainian Orthodox Church, as just one aspect of its campaign to discourage Ukrainian national aspirations. The process went into reverse when the Soviet Union collapsed, and the Ukrainian Orthodox Church demanded its properties back, and reasserted its role and rights in the life of the newly more or less independent state. Now the Ukrainian Orthodox Church will be concerned lest a revanchist Russia, and its ecclesial allies, marginalise it again. Russia has only a 10 year window of opportunity to recover its near abroad, and create large buffers of defensible space on its periphery, because its catastrophically declining population, due to alcoholism, poor health statistics, and low birth rate, mean that soon its armed forces will drastically shrink in size. For Russia it is now or never.
