Parish News

<u>Harvest Festival</u> This morning we celebrate God's goodness to us in creation. The collect and the intercessions will reflect the Harvest Festival theme.

<u>This morning's sermon</u> is entitled "an idyllic walk in the countryside." In the walk to Emmaus Luke provides us with a transition scene between the appearance of the risen Jesus to individuals, and later to the whole community. The former scenes are often surrounded by an atmosphere of shock and surprise.

This morning's one has a more pastoral quality to it, and its more tranquil ambience and tone are a clue to some subtle shifts developing in the content and style of the resurrection appearances.

Automatic payment tokens If you are giving to the parish by means of automatic payments, a highly desirable means of doing so, and wish to have something to place in the collection bag as a symbol of your offering, you will find some appropriate tokens you can uplift on the table at the back of the Church.

<u>Thursday Eucharist</u> The Thursday 10 am Eucharist will be celebrated in the Parish Lounge from now on through the Winter months.

<u>Technology news</u> The Church alarm system was repaired during the week by means of replacing the siren. Investigations continue as to appropriate means of developing a more robust security system for the Church and the Vicarage, particularly in the light of the high number of psycho-active substance and synthetic cannabis users in the surrounding community. One of the Church heat pumps had begun to blow cold air on a consistent basis, and has been repaired.

First Caversham lecture The first Caversham lecture for this year will be on Tuesday. Its subject will be Percy Dearmer, Vicar of St Mary's Primrose Hill, instigator of the English Hymnal, and generator of the Sarum Use, an English take on ceremonial, ritual and liturgy, designed to lead Anglo-Catholicism away from what he saw as a slavish copying of Roman Catholic practices. Conrad Noel, the eccentric and extreme socialist Vicar of Thaxted, will also be discussed. The Vicar and David Hoskins share the podium for this presentation, which will be made at 2 pm and then again at 7.30 pm. Ninian Comper, Church architect, will be the subject of the following lecture on Tuesday 13 May.

Ma Whea Commission The Ma Whea Commission has offered the General Synod, which meets in the Bay of Islands this month, a smorgasbord of 10 options to choose from, in dealing with possible changes to the marriage canons. They are: Affirm the Understanding, Preserving the Present Traditional Circumstances, Bishops to Determine what Equals Right Relationships in each diocese, Delegate to Diocesan Synods Power to Determine Right relationships in each diocese, Adopt a New Understanding (accept Gay Marriage), The Anglican Church Having Two Views (Tikanga Gay Church and Tikanga Orthodox), Dual Episcopacy (like the Flying Bishops option in the C of E), Planned Dismembering (an orderly break up of the Anglican Church into two varieties of Anglicanism in New Zealand along the fault lines of this issue), Anglican Church to Add a New Rite of Blessing by Priests of Those in a Same Sex Relationship, Adopt a Two Year Period of Focussed Discussion within Church Communities With a View to making a Decision in (say) 2016.
