Parish News

<u>This morning's gospel</u> reading concerns Jesus' going away arrangements. He will send the Advocate, the Spirit of truth, to stand by his followers, and to lead them into a deeper knowledge of God. And he goes away so that he can come back again, this time to complete and fulfil the human story.

<u>Diocesan Retreat</u> The Vicar will be away from Tuesday morning until Thursday morning at the Diocesan Retreat at Holy Cross, Mosgiel. This will be led by Fr Mark Chamberlain, the parish priest of Holy Name parish.

<u>Thursday Eucharist</u> The Thursday Eucharist in the coming week will be celebrated at the slightly later time of 10.30am

because the Vicar will be coming away from the Diocesan retreat that morning. This celebration is taking place in the Parish Lounge from now on through the Winter months.

Fourth Caversham lecture The fourth Caversham lecture for this year will be in a fortnight's time on Tuesday 3 June at 2 pm, and then again at 7.30 pm. This pause in the lecture programme is because the Vicar will be attending the Diocesan Retreat. The next lecture will profile Austin Farrer, Warden of Keble College, Oxford, a great preacher, philosopher and theologian. The final lecture, on Tuesday 10 June, will consider Michael Ramsey, Archbishop of Canterbury and theologian.

<u>Archdeaconry meeting to discuss Synod</u> The Bishop will discuss General Synod's handling of the above issue at an open meeting at St Johns Roslyn on Saturday 31 May at 10.30 am.

<u>Major celebrations coming up</u> Next Sunday we celebrate the feast of the Ascension, followed by Pentecost the following Sunday. As is our custom there will be a Vigil Mass of Pentecost that Saturday evening preceding Pentecost using the Liturgy of St Basil, followed by a potluck meal, in this way giving added emphasis to a feast that is as important as Easter, and which has not received its due in the Western Church.

<u>Patronal Festival</u> We are now just a month away from the celebration of our Patronal festival on Sunday 29 June. Suggestions about worthy and appropriate events for that important weekend in our life are welcome.

<u>Friendship group</u> The Friendship group will meet on Tuesday at

2 pm at Lorraine Mitchell's home at 23 Tainui Rd. Ronda Tatnell will be speaking about her recent travel experiences. **Sustainable living** The diocesan social justice working group is holding a workshop called Sustainable Living on Saturday 7

June, at St John's Roslyn from 10am to 3.30 pm. It will be led by Maureen Howard, who runs these courses for the Dunedin City Council. Maureen is very experienced and very practical. Vestry news Wednesday night's Vestry meeting deferred making a decision about upgrading the parish security systems until next month while further information is gathered. It is thought important to bring the hall, the Church, and the Vicarage into a common monitoring system so that the response to an alarm detonation does not depend on key parish personnel being on site. At present three security contractors are quoting on the work, and a fourth is to be brought into the mix. Strong support was expressed for the proposal for a Spring Flower Festival, and modest financial backing will be provided for that. Information is to be gathered regarding the possibility of a music and movement group meeting in the hall, and this possibility will be canvassed at a future parish forum. Kate Paterson, Tubby Hopkins, Heather Brooks and David Hoskins were elected as the parish nominators.
