Corpus Christi Today we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, in which we thank God for the gift of his risen life in holy communion.

This morning's sermon is entitled, "Devouring, Digesting, Assimilating, Indwelling," and considers the implications of today's gospel reading in which Jesus declares that, "My flesh is real food and my blood is real drink." We are to hunger and thirst for the living God, for as we receive him in communion we come to share in the intimate indwelling between the Father and the Son in the power of the Holy Spirit

<u>Clergy conference</u> After being in abeyance for the last two years the annual clergy upskilling event will take place at Holy Cross Mosgiel from 24 to 26 June in the coming week, its theme "Future models of ministry." As the Vicar will not return from this event until Thursday afternoon the celebrant at the Thursday morning Eucharist will be Fr Wiremu Quedley.

House blessing If you are moving house why not consider a house blessing. Our 1989 Prayer book makes provision for this, and the Vicar is only too happy to provide this ministry.

Replacing the flag Our Anglican Communion flag, recently featured in the Rock, has been badly ripped, and its repairs will not last long. Because it is a one off it is expensive to replace, and Adams Flags have suggested that we get four (fewer are not less expensive) on a more rugged material called polybunting. Parishioner subscriptions would be welcome to supplement the \$200 base funding provided by the Vestry.

Patronal Festival

Our Patronal festival will be celebrated next Sunday. Our guest preacher will be the Revd Eric Kyte, Vicar of St Johns, Roslyn, and Vicar General. After the 10.30 Service the Revd Jonathan Hicks (last year's guest preacher) and his family will join us for a parish forum at which they will tell us about their new life which is about to begin in the Solomons, where Jonathan will take up a teaching position at the Diocesan Theological College.

The celebrations continue on the Sunday afternoon with drinks and nibbles at 4 pm in the lounge, followed by Sung Evensong at 5 pm. It would be much appreciated if we could have as many of the parish family as possible at Church that Sunday.

Vestry news It was decided to replace the movement sensors in the Vicarage to prevent false alarms generated by their age. An additional movement sensor will be placed in the kitchen to cover the glass door in that renovated space. The Church will have an additional smoke sensor to cover the sanctuary, and the sacristy will have movement sensor placed there to replace the door activated alarm. An advertiser in the Rock has offered to host a parish function, and this generous offer was gratefully accepted. A parishioner request for some kind of history publication to accompany the 150th anniversary was considered. The Vicar intends to publish a series of parish history articles in the Rock, and these will be brought together into a monograph publication at that time. It was noted that instead of taping interviews with parishioners of mature years for the parish archives as a resource for a future parish history, these will now be filmed thanks to the co-operation of David Scoular, and these too could be a resource for a 150th anniversary publication.

Filming St Peters Last night's celebration of the Liturgy of St Basil and explanation of the foundations of eastern Orthodox Liturgy was filmed by David Scoular and will be posted on the parish web site. You can also view the recent lectures on "Great Anglo-Catholics of the 20th Century" there.
