**Today's sermon** is entitled "Those hindering cosmic powers," and considers today's Romans reading as to whether we have guardian angels who assist us in the spiritual contest with malign forces.

**The Assumption** The feast of the Assumption of our Lady will be celebrated on that same Sunday 17 August. In order to give due honour to this important celebration the film "England's Nazareth: a pilgrimage to the shrine of our Lady of Walsingham," will be shown in the Vicarage that afternoon, with Sung Evensong and Benediction to follow at 5 pm. A light meal of soup and rolls will follow the Service.

<u>Ministry of healing training event</u> On Saturday 23 August there will be a time of reflection and teaching for those who pray with others in the Lady Chapel each Sunday during communion. We will begin at 2 pm with a Eucharist in the Lady Chapel, to be followed by a time of teaching and discussion in the Vicarage.

**Gaza emergency appeal** Christian World Service is asking churches to pray for peace this Sunday as we recall a significant anniversary of the beginning of World War 1, the atomic bombing of Hiroshima, and the desperate need for peace in Gaza. CWS is appealing for donations to enable their development partner Department of Service to Palestinian Refugees to provide \$100 emergency grants to families in need of food, water, fuel or other help. They will fund the extension of the psychosocial programmes for children and mothers and four vocational training centres helping young people gain practical skills. The appeal will also fund three maternal health clinics providing medical services mostly to mothers and young children. **Bible in Schools** In the world we once knew Bible in Schools existed pretty much throughout the NZ state education system. It wasn't perfect - it was always a struggle to find enough motivated and competent teachers, and to get them to use the agreed syllabus, but it did give a smattering of religious knowledge to many children whose families never went near a Church. The first assault on it came from "Tomorrow's Schools" which enabled board of trustees, if they so chose, to ban religious instruction in that particular school, an option which some exercised, though in a few cases things became better as schools chose to have chaplains, something not previously possible. Now a different sort of attack is under way as per the case in Christchurch last week when a mother, who had withdrawn her child from the Bible in Schools class, complained to the human rights commission about her son being made to feel singled out as a result. This complaint is being backed up by the secular education network, a consortium of atheists intent on eliminating religious instruction in schools. Some schools, such as Christchurch East primary, have gone over to an opt in system in which instruction takes place in the lunch break for those who choose it. Out of a roll of 200 pupils 35 to 40 opt in. A recent nationwide survey has found that 37.7 % of primary and intermediate schools offer religious instruction, with 38.8% being in Canterbury, 17.9% being in Wellington, 33.3% in Auckland and 75.4% in Southland. If a child is to have a genuine choice about which faith to follow, and atheism is a faith of a bleak kind, then it must know what the options are, and have a basic religious literacy, otherwise it has no choice at all. As with the exclusion of God from many weddings and funerals now, we are seeing a determined effort by not a few to get God out of NZ life including our schools, but as the prophets of Israel pointed out long ago, interesting things start to happen in the life of a nation that turns away from God.
