Spring Flower Festival

St Peter's will be hosting a Spring Flower Festival over the weekend of 20-21 September. There will be displays of vestments and liturgical items for public inspection in the Church that weekend.

And Vestments With A Difference....

Not long before his death in the 1950's the famous French artist Henri Matisse was asked to design every aspect of the interior of a chapel for nuns at Vence in the south-east of France. The chapel was a small, understated building, with its main feature being its tall stained glass windows. Matisse considered it his greatest work. So great was his attention to detail that he also designed the vestments. Made out of silk, they have striking designs on them. The originals have since been on sold to the Metropolitan Museum of Modern Art in New York. In a four year project Fr Hugh Bowron had a New Zealand vestment maker Elizabeth Kimberley construct copies of them. These will be on display at St Peter's on the Saturday and Sunday afternoon of 20-21 September from 2 pm on, together with the best of St Peter's treasure trove of Eucharistic vestments. Fr Hugh Bowron will be on hand to act as a tour guide. Please come and inspect these remarkable church textiles.

Red Cross Choir Concert The Red Cross Choir will perform a programme of popular choral music today at 2 pm at the Kings and Queens performing arts centre. Tickets are \$10, with the proceeds going to the Dunedin Red Cross Community Transport Service.

Rent a battalion The diocese of Polynesia has requested prayer for the 45 Fijian soldiers kidnapped in Southern Lebanon, part of a UN peacekeeping force who try to keep warring factions apart. This is a reasonable and compassionate Christian request, (and the prayer may have already been answered) but the back story is rife with ambiguity. Indigenous Fijians are a warrior people, and the army is large for such a small island state. It is also a major revenue earner through these UN assignments. The Lebanese deployment is a long standing one, by means of which the leadership cadre has acquired considerable skills in counter insurgency warfare. These were put to good use in the Rabuka coup, and the successive ones after that, when democratic elections brought Indian led governments to power that the military didn't like. New Zealand has unsuccessfully opposed the UN employing the Fijian army in Lebanon until democracy is restored in Fiji. A major issue for Fijian society is a runaway military who believe themselves to be above and beyond civilian control.
