<u>Shirley Buxton RIP</u> Long time and much-loved parishioner, Shirley Buxton died at the Dunedin Hospice on Tuesday October 14. Fr Bernard Wilkinson conducted her funeral in St Peter's yesterday (Sat) at 2pm. The
