**Justin Welby delays Lambeth** Last month the Archbishop of Canterbury announced that the Lambeth Conference of Anglican Bishops from around the world, due to take place in 2018, would be delayed until a later date, to be jointly decided by the Primates of the Anglican Communion and himself. Presumably this is because he will be attempting to get as many Anglican Provinces to attend as possible to avoid what happened at the last conference when a rival gathering in Jerusalem attracted many Provinces. Justin Welby has been travelling widely around the Communion meeting key leaders, and has made reconciliation a key theme of his ministry. At stake is whether the majority of Provinces are prepared to go on accepting the authority of the Archbishop of Canterbury to call and lead such gatherings, and whether the at present disaffected Provinces see the gathering as one which is able to reach worthwhile decisions that the Anglican world is prepared to abide by.
