<u>The judgement of outsiders</u> In the preceding section of today's gospel reading Matthew has focussed on the judgement criteria

God will apply to believers at the last judgement. Today's gospel focuses on the judgement criteria that will apply to those outside the household of faith. As we shall hear in the sermon this is not as straightforward a matter as it at first appears. In a world in which many, including often our nearest and dearest, do not acknowledge Christ this is an issue of more than passing interest.

<u>Episcopal visit at Easter</u> Bishop Kelvin will co-preside at our Easter Vigil Service on Holy Saturday night next year (4 April 8 pm) at which Christine Reese will be Confirmed.

<u>Financial facts pamphlet</u> Next week parishioners on the parish roll will receive an information pamphlet outlining how we are doing relative to the budget for the year ahead that was given out at our AGM. With two months to run in the 2014 budget this will be both a report back aiming to inform, and also a request for assisting action where necessary. St Peters is committed to an annual placing before its membership of the importance of stewardship in our Christian walk.

<u>Next Frances Hodgkin's housegroup</u> The final meeting for the year of the Frances Hodgkin's housegroup will be on Monday 8 December at 2 pm in the Garden Lounge.

<u>Thursday Eucharist</u> The Holy Eucharist is celebrated in the Lady Chapel on Thursday's at 10 am.

<u>Cuts in theological education</u> The government has cut funding for theological education at Laidlaw College Auckland and at Auckland University, thus bringing about the closure of the Auckland University Theology department, and the redundancy of the Laidlaw theology teaching faculty. The Minister for Tertiary Education has commented that, "we are not in the business of training Sunday School Teachers." While Laidlaw has many students these will now be trainee counsellors and teachers, with the fine systematic theology and biblical studies department a thing of the past. Now the Otago University Theology department is the last man standing in this crucial area of theological endeavour within the university system. It is also a concerning sign of the further attrition of the humanities in our universities in favour of STEM – Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics.

Justin Welby's radical new community The Archbishop of Canterbury is establishing a radical new community at Lambeth Palace of young Christians aged 20 to 35. Called the St Anselm Community, its life will be distinguished by learning, prayer, love for one another, and love for the poor, so the community members can become more like Jesus. There will be a particular emphasis on providing opportunities within this community's life to meet and mix with people with different expressions of faith and different kinds of life, which is part of Justin Welby's reconciling vision for the Anglican Communion. Its leader, or Prior as he will be called, is the Revd Anders Litzell, a Swede who grew up in a Pentecostal tradition, worked for the Lutheran Church, and was then ordained an Anglican priest, and who is married to a South African, in a way, a paradigm life of the kind of embracing of difference that Justin Welby is keen on.
