<u>Christian World Service Appeal</u> This morning's Pebble contains an appeal envelope and explanatory literature about the CWS Christmas appeal, which this parish supports. It is commended to you for your generous support.

Why we should be relieved that the End hasn't come yet There is strand of theological opinion that considers talk of Christ's second coming as a mythological left over from a time when the Church was a marginalised and persecuted group, which leaves one wondering if Christ was mistaken or misreported in his gospel warnings about what comes next. Today's sermon offers the perspective that the gospel is based around the notion that the Kingdom of God was breaking in through the ministry of Jesus, and that God will bring the human story to an end through a decisive intervention in history. However, rather than idly wondering why God hasn't got around to doing this the Church should get down on its knees and thank God that he hasn't done so, for in its present compromised state it would be unprepared for such a disturbing encounter. But there is still time to sort itself out, the time God graciously provides for repentance and amendment of life.
