Parish News

<u>Today's sermon</u> is entitled "Sacrificial Living," and reflects on the Markan theme of repentance as a call to develop and deepen our life with Christ in a continuing conversion in which stamina and faithfulness over a lifetime transforms us decisively from within. <u>Frances Hodgkins in January</u> The Frances Hodgkins housegroup will have its first meeting for the year on Monday in the Garden Lounge at 2 pm.

Caversham lectures Planning is under way for this year's Caversham lectures. Topics and lecturers confirmed so far include Professor Blair Fitzharris on potential flooding hazards for the South Dunedin area in the light of the high water table and porous soils of the area, together with the possible impact of climate change and ocean inundation on this part of the city. David Hoskins will give a presentation on New Zealand's National Film Unit, and the way in which the Labour and National governments found it a powerful communication tool for their different visions of New Zealand. Dr Alex Trapeznik of the Otago History department will give a talk on the history of Dunedin's Warehouse Precinct area, formerly at the epicentre of Dunedin's prosperity, and now being re-developed in interesting ways. Dates for these lectures have yet to be finalised.

<u>Next Sunday</u> will be the feast of the Presentation of the Lord, commonly known as Candlemas.

New Shrubs for the Eastbourne St garden Tubby and Averil Hopkins have been continuing their much appreciated gardening activities in the Church gardens in January. Their focus now moves to the Eastbourne St garden area adjacent the hall. They need about \$500 for shrubs and bark to further develop this area. While a funding application for this purpose will go the February Vestry meeting parishioner donations for this purpose would be much appreciated, and can be handed to the Vicar.

<u>Two Episcopal visits</u> Bishop Victoria Mathews will be the celebrant and preacher on the Sunday of our 150th anniversary celebrations, Michaelmas 27 September 2015. This is because our Bishop will be on study leave then. Bishop Kelvin will be with us on Holy Saturday evening 4 April to preach and Confirm at our Easter Vigil and first Mass of Easter at 8 pm.

New arrangements at St Barnabas From now on the Vicar will celebrate the Eucharist on two Tuesdays a month at St Barnabas rest home at the usual time of 11 am, generally at fortnightly intervals. In the intervening weeks he will visit to spend time talking to residents, and being pastorally available to them. The new arrangement reflects the fact that the Vicar attends Diocesan Trust Board meetings on one Tuesday morning in the month, and that Mass attendances, which have been lower over the past year, are more likely to grow through a deeper level of pastoral connection and involvement in the weeks between Services. The roster for St Barnabas Services has been posted on the web site, and on the Link noticeboard.
