<u>Michaelmas Episcopal visit</u> Bishop Victoria Mathews will be the celebrant and preacher on the Sunday of our 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations, Michaelmas 27 September 2015.

St Peters Renovation Fund In 2013 the Vestry resolved to amalgamate the St Peter the Less and the St Peter compounding bequests to form the St Peters Renovation Fund, with the intention of giving the parish the necessary financial capacity to renovate, strengthen or replace the Church building in due course. This was invested in the Diocesan Trust Board Growth Fund, a unitised trust that invests mostly in the share market. At the time of its establishment the renovation fund was worth \$104,902. Its value would be rather more now as the per unit value rose to a record high of \$2.51 last month off the back of a booming share market. The fund is designed to attract parishioner donations and legacies, and this it has already done because of its obvious value in securing the future of the parish. The government and the DCC are now taking a more relaxed approach to earthquake strengthening, and the parish leadership recently learned that we now have until 2032 to strengthen the church, with a detailed engineering report on how this would be accomplished not required until shortly before work commenced. However the church faces more immediate challenges than that. Springy floorboards indicate that rising damp is rotting the floor in several places, the west wall continues to lean out potentially endangering the cottage, and the roof is approaching the end of its life. To paraphrase the conclusion of the poem on the front cover - St Peters church building has not done with its changes.
