Drop in student numbers Otago university has experienced a noticeable drop in student numbers this year, with a consequent concerning spare capacity situation for several halls of residence. Four factors have brought this situation about. There was a drop in the New Zealand birth rate at about the origin date of this year's first year entrants. Last year the marking pass level for the University exam was more challenging, resulting in some who had pre-enrolled hoping that their NCEA levels would get them through being disappointed. Auckland and Wellington's universities have aggressively offered scholarships to dis-incentive the young adults of their cities going south to study. This is a bidding war that Otago does not have the financial heft to match. Many young adults now perceive Wellington to be a groovy, happening city, with funky suburbs like the Aro Valley adjacent to Victoria, being the place to be. Dunedin by contrast has suffered in its public image from well publicised disorder incidents such as couch burning. As Dunedin has stagnated as a city it has come to be heavily dependent on the university to stabilise its economic and financial position. While this year's diminished intake might be just a temporary blip nothing can be taken for granted in today's world, as witness Canterbury, now sadly diminished to just over 14,000 students, with an arts faculty in terminal decline. But Christchurch has the city size to shrug this set back off. For Dunedin such a development would be very concerning.
