Parish News

<u>The Easter season film season</u> Running over five weeks on successive Tuesday nights throughout Paschal time between Easter and Pentecost five films will be shown in the Vicarage. Mass will be celebrated in the Vicarage at 7 pm, followed immediately by the screening of the film. This week's film is *George Mackay Brown – Hamnavoe*, profiling the famous 20th century Orkney poet, and one of his better known poems.

<u>Evensong and Benediction</u> There will be a Service of Evensong and Benediction this evening at 5 pm, followed by a social gathering in the lounge afterwards.

<u>Christchurch Cathedral Choir visit confirmed</u> The administration of Christchurch cathedral confirmed late last week the visit of the full choir of around 28 men and boys voices to the main Service at our Patronal festival on Sunday 28 June. The choir will rehearse at St Peters on Saturday evening, returning for the 10.30 am Service. The parish will provide lunch for them with a shared potluck meal. They will then sing Evensong at the Cathedral at 3 pm.

Pentecost Vigil Service We are now more than half way through the Easter season, which will conclude on Pentecost Sunday 24 May. This parish makes a big thing of Pentecost to emphasise that the descent of the Hoy Spirit on the Apostles is a peer event with Easter, and not just a roll out consequence of it. It is our custom to have a special Service on the eve of Pentecost at 6 pm Saturday. The Service consists of a Vigil of appropriate readings, which then flows in to the celebration of the Eucharist according to the liturgy of St Basil, a special Eucharistic liturgy which we use by Episcopal permission. The Service is followed by shared meal in the lounge.

Human rights in Saudi Arabia There was much media and political discussion this past week about the desirability and possibility of John Key raising human rights issues with his Saudi hosts. Not discussed and almost certainly not raised is the prohibition of Christian worship in the Kingdom, not just in Saudi society but even in expatriate cantonments where foreigners working in Saudi cluster together. In fact Christians do gather on Sunday covertly and illegally to worship, and risk arrest thereby. The excuse given for this extraordinary prohibition is that no rival worship of false religions can be permitted in close proximity to the holy places of Islam. One wonders what would happen if western societies banned Mosques and Islamic worship within their borders?
