Parish News

Next Sunday The feast of the Ascension falls in the coming week on Thursday. This parish transfers onto Sunday such major midweek feasts, so the Ascension will be the focus of our thoughts and prayers and hymns then.

The Easter season film season Running over five weeks on successive Tuesday nights throughout Paschal time between Easter and Pentecost five films will be shown in the Vicarage. Mass will be celebrated in the Vicarage at 7 pm, followed immediately by the

screening of the film. This week's film is *Buck*, a documentary about Buck Brannaman, America's most accomplished horse whisperer who transcended the appalling abuse dished out to him by his father to develop a remarkable empathy for the animals he works with. This is the man who trained Robert Redford for his role in *The Horse Whisper*. At the clinics he holds around the America he explains that he is dealing with horses with people problems, i.e. their owners.

<u>Potluck lunch</u> As is usual on the second Sunday of the month a potluck lunch follows the 10.30 am Service. All welcome.

<u>Francis Hodgkins</u> The Francis Hodgkins house group will meet next on Monday 18 May.

<u>Christchurch Cathedral Choir visit confirmed</u> The administration of Christchurch cathedral has confirmed the visit of the full choir of around 28 men and boys voices to the main Service at our Patronal festival on Sunday 28 June. The parish will provide lunch for them with a shared potluck meal. They will then sing Evensong at the Cathedral at 3 pm.

Pentecost Vigil Service It is our custom to have a special Service on the eve of Pentecost at 6 pm Saturday 23 May. The Service consists of a Vigil of appropriate readings, which then flows in to the celebration of the Eucharist according to the liturgy of St Basil, a special Eucharistic liturgy which we use by Episcopal permission. Gloriavale Media attention has turned to the reclusive Christian utopian community on the West Coast since departed community members have shared their experiences and thoughts about life there. Growing up in Rangiora in the 1960's the Vicar can remember contact with Pastor Cooper and his Pentecostal Church with its aggressive evangelising methods and reputation for splitting up families. A member of our Anglican youth group followed them into exile when they withdrew from the world to become the Cust Christian Fellowship. Then two Anglican ordinands from College House joined them, and so enabled them to found their own exclusive school. One of them has long since rejoined the Anglican fold to become a very liberal clergyman indeed. An issue lying behind all this, and one which has long puzzled this writer, is why the government allows sectarian groups that exclude themselves from the wider society to found and run their own schools. Whatever else schools do or don't do they socialise their pupils into a wider world and open society, and accustom them to the reality that they must allow for and compromise with people who are very different to them in a mixed social world. Appreciating difference and pluralism is in fact a Trinitarian virtue since the Triune persons are not a homogenised reality. One wonders too about the wisdom of home schooling, having met some alarmingly strange parents whose children might well have appreciated and benefited from a break from the claustrophobic embrace of home.
