<u>Potluck lunch</u> A potluck lunch follow this morning's 10.30 am Service. All welcome.

<u>Wardens meeting</u> The Vicar meets with the Wardens tomorrow. Please mention to Tubby Hopkins or Kate Paterson any matters you want raised at that meeting.

<u>Companion mission link to Revd Jonathan Hicks</u> Please contact the Vicar if you would like to join him in becoming a parish mission companion to the Revd Jonathan Hicks and his family as they prepare to move to the Solomon's in August. The parish is developing a mission link relationship with this missionary family.

<u>Diocesan Mission Giving Summary</u> The Anglican Board of Missions has published a league table summary of missions giving. Well in front is St Johns Roslyn at \$7,295 per annum, then St Matthews Dunedin at \$6,000, with St Lukes Oamaru next at \$4,585, and then St Marks Balclutha at \$3,220, followed by Gore at \$2,919 and then Tairei at \$2,400. We are in this middle band at \$2,131. Surprisingly the Cathedral does not give to missions, and All Saints gave just \$161. Overall Dunedin diocese gave \$54,112 last year, the smallest contribution of the Pakeha dioceses. Its mission target this year is \$61,000.

Bishops fundraiser for Vanuatu Cyclone Pam prevented Bishop Kelvin visiting our companion diocese of Banks and Torres (Vanuatu), the poorest diocese in Melanesia. He is promoting a fundraiser on their behalf on Wednesday 1 July, which is the film "Still Life" at the Rialto at 7.45 pm, with a suggested donation of \$18. A talk by Pauline McKay, National Director of CWS precedes this in the cathedral at 7 pm. Further details on the Link noticeboard.

The one in one hundred argument Mayor David Cull and DCC officials have defended the performance of South Dunedin's drainage system in the ODT last week by arguing that last week's flood was a unique one in one hundred year event that no stormwater and waste water system could have coped with. Yet the report the DCC commissioned last year by Emeritus Professor of Geography Blair Fitzharris on Dunedin's vulnerability to the impacts of climate change made it clear that as the 21st century develops intensity of design rainfall events will become 20% greater, leading to higher storm runoff. Larger floods are expected, especially with a likely increase in the frequency of subtropical storms. Surface flooding and salinity will become more problematic in low-lying areas with low lying densely populated urban areas, especially South Dunedin, including the St Clair and St Kilda shoreline being particularly at risk. In the opinion of this writer we are well on the way to this new state of affairs with high rainfall events becoming more common. In other words, rather than a one in one hundred years event this will become the new normal. At issue is a below par drainage system that has not received the priority renewal attention it deserves in an area with a high water table and particularly porous soils. This in turn raises the question of what local government exists to do. Surely adequate and effective drainage, sewage and water supply systems come first as the core business of local government well before any other priorities.
