New Dean for Christchurch Cathedral Last Thursday Bishop Victoria Matthews announced that the Reverend Lawrence Kimberley would be the new Dean of the transitional Cathedral. At present the Vicar of Opawa, Lawrence is also a Church Property Trustee, a Canon of Christchurch Cathedral, and is the Chairman of the Anglican Pension Board. Trained as an accountant, he is also an organist and accomplished church musician. He was trained at St Johns College Auckland, and holds a Batchelor of Theology from the Melbourne College of Divinity. His wife Elizabeth paints the St Peters Caversham Paschal Candle each year, and made the Vicar's Matisse styled vestments. She runs her own small vestment making business, and has made the albs for many South island clergy. Given his combination of skills Lawrence is a safe pair of hands for the Cathedral to go into the next phase of its life, and to address the cash flow issues it has. He is liberal Anglo-Catholic in his churchmanship, with a considerable interest in liturgy done to a high standard. He comes from a Nelson diocese clergy family, with both his Father and Grandfather being priests of an evangelical persuasion. Lawrence Kimberley's was the organist of St Mary's Addington when Fr Hugh was the Vicar there. After ordination Lawrence was curate of St Michaels Christchurch, then Vicar of Heathcote Mt Pleasant.
