Anniversary Service This morning we welcome Bishop Victoria Matthews as our celebrant and preacher at our 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary Service. This is particularly appropriate as the Diocese of Dunedin did not come in to existence until some years after the establishment of the parish of St Peter's Caversham. Bishop Harper, first Bishop of Christchurch, presided at the consecration of the first St Peters on South road. The Service begins with a procession around the Church, which you are most welcome to

join. After the Service we will board the bus to proceed to lunch at I-Tees function centre in East Taieri.

**Evensong and Benediction** Our weekend celebrations conclude with Evensong and Benediction at 4 pm.

<u>Vicar on leave</u> The Vicar will be away on leave from Monday until 17 October. Fr James Harding will take the Sunday Services for the next two Sundays. Funeral cover will be provided by the Vicar of Roslyn, the Revd Eric Kyte.

Archbishop of Canterbury launches monastic-inspired community for young Christians 36 young men and women from across the UK and around the world became the first members of the Archbishop of Canterbury's new monastic-inspired community at Lambeth Palace. The Community of St Anselm - a programme for Christians aged 20–35 to spend a year praying, studying ethics and theology, and serving the poorest in local communities – was officially launched in a special Service in Lambeth Palace Chapel. The first intake of the Community has 16 residential members from around the world – including the USA, Kenya and Australia – who will live in Lambeth Palace. They are joined by 20 non-resident members who will be living in London and continuing their jobs in finance, media, education, the civil service and elsewhere.

### The rest of the year in prospect:

- The **St Peters Caversham Festival of Flowers** will run over the weekend of 17-18 October in the Church and in the Hall. The Festival will be organised and presented by the Dunedin Floral Art Society. Entry is by gold coin donation with the proceeds going to the Night Shelter.
- The Caversham lectures run throughout November, beginning with God, the Devil and the Demon Drink on Tuesday 3 November in which Associate Professor John Stenhouse explores the connection between Dunedin's churches, first wave feminists and the movement for Prohibition. Dunedin's Warehouse **Precinct** is the theme of Associate Professor Alex Trapeznik's lecture on 10 November, with Emeritus Professor Blair Fitzharris giving a presentation on 17 November on the potential vulnerability of South Dunedin to coastal flooding and ocean inundation. Then on 24 November David Hoskins will speak on the use successive NZ Government's made of the New Zealand Film Unit documentaries to develop a mythology of nation. These lectures will begin at 7.30 pm in the parish lounge.
- On Sunday 29 November, the first Sunday in Advent, there will be a Service at 5 pm based around John Donne's **La Corona** sequence of poems presenting a Marian perspective on the main events of Christ's life, with music in a Jacobean mode.
